Council Updates

Council Extends Deadline for Transit-Oriented Development Agreement

At its April 12, 2022 meeting, the City Council approved a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the Town and a co-developer team of AMLI Residential and Stream Realty Partners to execute a multi-phase, transit-oriented mixed use development on Town and DART-owned land in the vicinity of the future Addison Silver Line Station. Four

subsequent amendments to the MOU were approved as the Town and the developer team worked to address the due diligence, zoning, and concept plan process as well as the draft incentive agreements, ground leases, and other documents necessary to advance the project. Since the approval of the fourth MOU amendment in June 2023, Stream Realty Partners has withdrawn from the project and will no longer develop the office portion.

Council approved a fifth amendment to the MOU at its October 24 meeting that extends the term of the MOU until January 31, 2024. It does not change any of the current provisions relating to incentives or the anticipated office, retail, and residential uses and design of the project. This extension will give the Town and AMLI Residential time to identify and select a new office developer. If this occurs, further amendments to the MOU will be necessary to address any updated terms and changes to the project schedule.

Police Chief Provides Public Safety Update to Council

At the October 24 City Council Meeting, Addison Police Chief Paul Spencer shared a year-end statistical summary and activity report, as well as updates on crime prevention, community policing, and efforts to address homelessness.

Over the last year, Addison Police Department (APD) responded to 20,938 calls for service but recorded more than twice as many self-initiated activities. Chief Spencer discussed crime trends, with a particular focus on thefts of high-value sports cars by organized groups near 5000 and 5100 Belt Line Road. The response from the police included heightened enforcement measures, increased marked unit patrols, intelligence-led strategies, and collaboration with federal and regional partners.

Community policing remains a cornerstone of the department's strategy. Chief Spencer advised residents to secure their vehicles, homes, and belongings by following recommended safety measures including proper lighting and the installation of exterior cameras. While officers actively patrolled parks, trails, and residential areas, conducted vacation watches, and addressed suspicious activities, APD needs assistance from the community to report unusual activity.

Addressing the ongoing challenge of homelessness, Chief Spencer shared that APD partners with organizations like Metrocrest Services to provide assistance to those in need. He also announced a Homelessness Educational Seminar that Metrocest Services is hosting for Addison residents on November 6 at 6:30pm at the Addison Conference Centre.

He shared that the new Addison Police Reporting Online initiative that allows people to "Be A PRO" by reporting various incidents online has already been used numerous times, saving officers hours of time. While the "A PRO" platform provides an online alternative for reporting things like graffiti, ID theft, or car burglaries, Chief Spencer emphasized that the Addison Police Department remains deeply committed to serving the community in person. Chief Spencer's presentation demonstrated the Addison Police Department's commitment to public safety through proactive policing, community collaboration, and addressing evolving challenges such as property crimes and homelessness.

At its October 24 meeting, the Council appointed 14 residents and business leaders to serve on a South Quorum Road Study Public Advisory Committee. This summer, the Council approved an agreement for the design of the Quorum Road reconstruction project which will extend from Arapaho Road to the Dallas North Tollway. The project includes the creation of pedestrian and activity spaces in the South Quorum Business District, which is south of Belt Line Road. Funds for the project were approved by Addison voters as part of Proposition B in the 2019 Bond Election. Addison Website to Get Facelift

The City Council approved a contract with Granicus for a new city website at its October 24 meeting. The current site was launched in 2019 and the platform it is built on has reached its "end of life." The new site will include the main website, as well as subsites for Parks and Recreation, Addison Airport, Addison Police Department, and Economic Development. The redesign will include data analysis of the current website, user research, and user testing.

- Metrocare Services: The Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic at Metrocare provides quality, accessible, and comprehensive mental health care to post-9/11 veterans, service members, and their families.
- Metrocrest Services: Metrocrest Services is focused on assisting families, individuals, and senior adults who are coping with crisis situations, need help stabilizing their lives, or require support to live independently.
- Woven Health Clinic: Woven Health Clinic is a charitable clinic that provides free and low-cost health care services for people who live in Dallas, Carrollton, Coppell, Addison, and Farmers Branch who cannot afford it.

2023 Regional Transit Tour Explores Future of Transit Connectivity in North Texas

Hosted by the Transit Coalition of North Texas, this tour featured the transit-oriented developments along the Silver Line. It started in Richardson at the City Line/Bush Station, continued to the Addison Circle Station, and finally ended at the Grapevine Station. The tour guides provided updates from DART on the rail line's construction progression as well as how the Silver Line will connect riders to DFW Airport and Trinity Metro's TEXRail. Participants included elected officials and staff members from the entire North Texas region, providing a forum for discussions on the region's future

opportunities for mobility connectivity and economic development, as well as how we may provide a first-class experience as riders move throughout the Metroplex.


