Council Updates

Public Hearings for November 14 City Council Meeting

The following Public Hearings will take place at the November 14 City Council Meeting that will take place at the Addison Conference Centre at 7:30pm. The agenda will be <u>posted on</u> the <u>Town's website</u> three days before the meeting.

- <u>Case 1892-SUP/4875 Belt Line Road (Home2 Suites)</u>. Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request to amend Special Use Permit (SUP), Ordinance No. 013-051, for property located at 4875 Belt Line Road, that is currently zoned Commercial-2 (C-2), to allow modifications to the development plan.
- <u>Case 1893-SUP/4960 Arapaho Road (Radisson Hotel).</u> Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request to amend Special Use Permit (SUP), Ordinance No. 098-022, for property located at 4960 Arapaho Road, that is currently zoned Planned Development (PD), Ordinance No 004-048, to allow modifications to the development plan.
- <u>Case 1897-SUP/4006 Belt Line Road, Suite 100 (Montessori Institute of North Texas).</u> Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request for a Special Use Permit (SUP) for property located at 4006 Belt Line Road, Suite 100, that is currently zoned Planned Development (PD), through Ordinance No. 460, and amended by Ordinance No. 085-003, to allow an educational institution.
- <u>Case 1900-Z/16675 Addison Road (Phase II).</u> Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request to amend the development standards and approve a development plan for Phase II of a 12.22± acre property located at 16675 Addison Road, currently zoned Planned Development (PD), Ordinance No. 023-32, to allow for the construction of an office/warehouse development with associated site improvements.

Public Hearings for November 15 Planning and Zoning Commission Meeting

 currently zoned Local Retail (LR), to allow an educational institution.
- <u>Case 1902-SUP/3795 Belt Line Road (McDonald's)</u>. Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request to amend Special Use Permit (SUP), Ordinance No. 097-044, for property located at 3795 Belt Line Road, that is currently zoned Planned Development (PD), to allow modifications to the development plan.
- <u>Case 1901-SUP/5555 Celestial Road (White Rock Chapel)</u>. Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request for a Special Use Permit (SUP) to allow a Religious Institution on 1.28± acres located at the northwest corner of Celestial Road and Winnwood Road (5555 Celestial Road), that is currently zoned Planned Development (PD), through Ordinance No. O91-038.

New Unified Development Code (UDC) Section Released for Review!

Addison is currently reviewing and updating its development regulations to make them clearer and ensure they align with the Town's long-term goals and vision. The draft section related to "Signs and Wireless Communication Facilities" (WCF) is now available on <u>addisonudc.org</u>. We encourage the community to review the draft and share their feedback by emailing <u>udc@addisontx.gov</u>.

The UDC Advisory Committee and project team will be meeting at the Addison Conference Centre on Wednesday, November 15 at 1:30pm to discuss the newly proposed sections. This meeting will be broadcast live and recorded for later viewing on the Town's website.

Metrocrest Services Discusses Homelessness in Addison and the Region



On Monday, November 6, Metrocrest Services Director of Homeless Resources Melanie Meijering shared some statistics surrounding homelessness and provided some ways the community can help address the issue.


Facts:

- Texas ranks 5th in the country for the largest homeless population.
- Up to 78% of the U.S. population lives paycheck to paycheck and nearly half of those can't cover a \$400 emergency expense.
- 20% of the homeless population is chronically homeless.
- The U.S. is short 47 million affordable housing units; Dallas County is short 20,000.
- 38.6% of sheltered homeless individuals are disabled.
- The poverty line in Dallas County is \$14,880 per year for an individual adult and \$29,950 for a family of four.
- 99% of people living below the poverty line are NOT homeless.
- Dallas County has 2,000 beds for 4,500 unsheltered people.

Meijering explained that homelessness typically occurs when a crisis like an accident, job loss, or mental health breakdown hits someone already living on the edge of poverty, and they don't have any family or friends that are willing or able to help or they have lost the ability to connect with that support system. In the Metrocrest area, the average number of years an individual has been homeless is 4.34. Some of the gaps in service that contribute to that timeline include obvious issues such as lack of shelter beds and affordable housing, but other issues such as access to showers and laundry and lost or stolen i.d.s are serious impediments to finding and keeping jobs.

On Tuesday, November 7, Addison held a ribbon cutting to launch the new fitness court at Vitruvian Park. Mayor Bruce Arfsten, Deputy Mayor Pro Tempore Guillermo Quintanilla, and Council Members Nancy Craig and Marlin Willesen came to celebrate the launch and

see a demonstration presented by Train with Trey Bootcamps.

Located on the west side of Vitruvian Park between Park Road and the Vitruvian Trail, the Fitness Court is designed by fitness experts to deliver a powerful seven-movement workout program. You can download the Fitness Court App to act as a coach-in-your pocket, available on <u>iOS</u> and <u>Android</u>.

On Friday, November 3, Dallas artist Pascale M. Pryor installed *Quintet*, a composition of five steel and glass fish sculptures arranged in a dynamic "school" formation, at Vitruvian Park. Located south of the Amphitheater and adjacent to the park's pond, the sculptures measure a combined length of 25 feet, with the tallest reaching a maximum height of 42 inches.

Pryor's use of steel and glass materials allows for an intriguing interplay of light and color, enhancing the sculptures' visual appeal. The installation is a collaboration between the Town of Addison, the Addison Arbor Foundation, and UDR. Pryor also created "Aigue-Marine" in Bosque Park.


