Council Updates

Fiscal Year 2023 Budget Amendments Approved by Council

At the September 26 City Council meeting, Chief Financial Officer Steven Glickman presented Council with the second amendment to the Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 budget. Each year, Finance staff reviews the budget to determine which items should be recognized with formal budget amendments. When budget variances occur that are outside of the authority of the City Manager, these adjustments are presented to the Council in the form of a budget amendment. The FY2023 budget was adopted by Council on September 12, 2022. This is the second amendment to the FY2023 Town of Addison annual budget.

The major General Fund items highlighted in the amendment totaled \$741,000 but were offset by an equal increase in sales tax. These included transfers to the Facility Maintenance Fund, personnel costs in the General Services and Finance Departments, street maintenance, and replacement of a damaged bus shelter.

Additionally, the amendment authorized the City Manager to transfer unexpended appropriations and excess revenue from the FY2023 budget to the FY2024 Self-Funded Special Projects Fund. It also allocated funds from the prior year's Self-Funded Special Projects Fund encumbrances for several projects including new fire station bay door grill gates, Wheeler Bridge painting, and the Vitruvian Park Fitness Court.

A Utility Fund appropriation of \$250,000 was approved to provide funding for higher than anticipated wholesale water purchases due to a hotter and dryer spring and summer than anticipated. These additional appropriations were offset by corresponding increased water sales revenue, resulting in a net impact to the Utility Fund of \$0.

Council Makes Appointments to Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee

To support the Town's Comprehensive Plan update process, the City Council appointed a 25-member Advisory Committee at its September 26 meeting that consists of residents and business representatives, as well as a member of the Planning & Zoning Commission and three legacy members. Legacy members are residents with a long history of service to the Town who can share context on how the Town has evolved. This committee will

serve as a sounding board for staff and the consultant as they develop the new comprehensive plan.



Construction Corner

Three-Day Marsh Lane Closure Scheduled for 9/29 - 10/2



Archer Western Herzog (AWH), DART's Silver Line contractor, is planning a full closure of Marsh Lane at the railroad crossing just north of Arapaho Road from **Friday**, **September 29 at 8pm - Monday**, **October 2 at 6am**. The full closure is necessary to lay new rail across Marsh in one piece with no joints. Traffic heading north on Marsh will be detoured to Arapaho and traffic heading south onto Country Club. Please consider alternate routes during the closure.

Expect Road Closures on Quorum Drive on Saturday, September 30 for MK5K Race



Mary Kay is hosting a 5k and one-mile fun run on Saturday, September 30. Please be aware of road closures and expect delays around Addison Circle from 7am - 10am. The run will begin at 8am and most streets will re-open by 10am. A map and more information on alternate routes can be found here, but here are the highlights:

- **Quorum Drive** Closed from the north side of Addison Circle to Westgrove Drive, including all intersections and driveway approaches in between.
- Keller Springs Closed from Ledgemont to Dallas Tollway
- Airport Parkway Closed from west side of Quorum Drive to Meridian Lane

All Midway Road Traffic from Keller Springs to Lindbergh Switched to New Southbound Pavement





On Thursday, September 28, Midway Road traffic north of Belt Line Road was switched to the newly constructed southbound pavement from Keller Springs Road to Lindbergh Drive. There is now one lane of traffic in each direction and a continuous turn lane. This adjustment is designed to facilitate the renovation of the existing northbound lanes.

Drivers should pay close attention to the traffic control and lane assignments in this area and observe the location of signal heads and directional signage at the intersections. Please remember that the speed limit along this area is 40 MPH.

From Spring Valley Road to Belt Line Road, construction is progressing on the sidepath trail, retaining walls, and barrier-free sidewalk ramps. Final grading work, irrigation, landscape improvements, and traffic signal work will follow to complete this segment of the project. Installation of the new 16 inch waterline under the DART Right-of-Way is complete and final backfilling and testing should be completed within the next month.

Metrocrest Chamber of Commerce Celebrates Dolce Paradiso with a Ribbon Cutting





Addison Appoints Latesha Dejua as New Director of Human Resources



Nationwide Emergency Alert Test Planned of October 4



FEMA plans to conduct a nationwide test of its Emergency Alert System (EAS) and Wireless Emergency Alert (WEA) on **Wednesday**, **October 4** at approximately 1:20pm.

How will this affect you?

- Wireless phones should receive a test message accompanied by a unique tone and vibrations. The messages will read: "THIS IS A TEST of the National Wireless Emergency Alert System. No action is needed."
- If Spanish is the set language, the message will read, "ESTA ES UNA PRUEBA del Sistema Nacional de Alerta de Emergencia. No se necesita acción."
- People listening to radio and television broadcasts will hear a one-minute test
 message similar to the regular monthly test. It will state: "This is a nationwide test of
 the Emergency Alert System, issued by the Federal Emergency Management
 Agency, covering the United States from 14:20 to 14:50 hours ET. This is only a
 test. No action is required by the public."

The purpose of the Oct. 4 test is to ensure that the systems continue to be effective means of warning the public about emergencies, particularly those on the national level. In case the Oct. 4 test is postponed due to widespread severe weather or other significant events, the back-up testing date is Oct. 11.

Trees Marked with Yellow Ribbons Part of the Town's Tree Inventory Project

The Parks Department is implementing a new tree inventory software which will help the


Town better manage Addison's Urban Forest. Starting Wednesday, October 11, two arborists will be locating, cataloguing, and photographing a total of 7,500 trees in parks, trails, Rights-of-Way, Town facilities, and streetscapes in Addison. After a tree has been documented, a yellow ribbon will be tied around it to indicate that it has already been inventoried. The trees are not being removed and the ribbons will be discarded once the project is complete.

The goal is to inventory approximately 250 trees a day, so the work will take roughly two weeks to complete, weather permitting. Once the survey has been completed, the information will be uploaded into the new software and the Town's GIS database.


