Council Updates

Council Holds First Public Hearing on Fiscal Year 2024 Proposed Budget

Council held a Public Hearing on the <u>proposed Fiscal Year 2024 budget and tax rate</u> on September 5. A second Public Hearing will take place during the September 12 City Council Meeting. Council will consider adoption of the FY24 budget and tax rate, which will go into effect on October 1 at its September 12 meeting.

Volunteers Needed to Serve on Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee

Addison is preparing to update its Comprehensive Plan which will set strategic policy direction and action items for how Addison's built environment may evolve over time. Key policy topics include:

- Housing
- Growth & redevelopment
- Infrastructure & mobility
- · Social amenities
- Fiscal sustainability

Community participation is a vital step in the planning process and a crucial part of the engagement process is the creation of a Comprehensive Plan Advisory Committee (CPAC). The Committee will include a dedicated group of 25 Addison residents and business community members. The City Council is looking for applicants who have a desire to work collectively to guide the development of an aspirational vision and sustainable, implementable strategies addressing the broad range of policy issues that the Town will face over the next 20 years.

The deadline is Monday, September 18 and interested volunteers can apply below.

Volunteers Needed to Serve on South Quorum Activation Advisory Committee

Addison is preparing for the design and reconstruction of Quorum Road from Arapaho Road and extending to the Dallas North Tollway. The project will also address needs identified in the Parks, Recreation, and Open Space Master Plan and in the Vision Plans for Quorum Art Walk. The plans made recommendations regarding the need for the creation of pedestrian and activity spaces in the South Quorum Business District, which is south of Belt Line Road, and also involves businesses on Landmark Place and Landmark Boulevard. Funds for the project, along with funds for reconstruction of Quorum Road, were approved by Addison voters in the 2019 Bond Election.

Addison is seeking applications from interested Addison residents and South Quorum business community representatives to serve as a member of the Public Advisory Committee to help inform the conceptual plan for the area. Participants must have the availability to participate in 3 group meetings and several additional public meetings held over the course of 4 - 6 months.

The consultant on the project recommends the committee consist of 14 members appointed by Council with equal representation from Addison residents and employees who work in the South Quorum Business District. If you would like to be considered, please submit a completed application no later than 5pm on September 14.

IMPORTANT PARKING NOTE FOR SEPTEMBER 12 MEETING

Addison Circle from Addison Road to Witt Place will officially close on Monday, September 11 at 9am in preparation for Addison Oktoberfest. Guests attending the September 12 City Council Meeting are asked to park in the Addison Conference Centre parking lot which can be accessed from either Addison Road or Morris Avenue. The only access to the Conference Centre will be through the courtyard located between the Conference Centre and the Theatre. Thank you for your patience as Addison prepares to host its 36th Addison Oktoberfest.

<u>Case 1877-Z/Trammell Crow Mixed Use.</u> Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request to rezone 10.1± acres generally located at the southeast corner of Belt Line Road and Surveyor Boulevard, from Planned Development (PD) to the Belt Line District, to allow a mixed use development comprised of multifamily residential and live/work dwelling units (apartment complex), townhomes (single-family unit, attached), restaurant and retail uses, and associated private open space and common areas, through the approval of a concept plan and associated major waiver requests related to block length, 4th floor building façade setback, freestanding restaurant building height, building entry and parking structure design requirements.

<u>Case 1890-Z/4900 Arapaho Road (One Addison Place PD Amendment).</u> Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request to amend the permitted uses and development plans for Planned Development (PD) Ordinance No. O20-53, for a 0.57± acre property located at 4900 Arapaho Road, to allow multifamily residential use, not to exceed one dwelling unit, within a 5-story commercial building.

<u>Case 1884-SUP/4021 Belt Line Road, Suite 107 (Luxe).</u> Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request for a Special Use Permit (SUP) for property

located at 4021 Belt Line Road, Suite 107, that is currently zoned Planned Development (PD), through Ordinance No. 017-07, to allow a restaurant with the sale of alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption.

<u>Case 1889-SUP/14960 Landmark Boulevard (Holiday Inn Express & Suites).</u> Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on a request to amend Special Use Permit (SUP), Ordinance No. 014-022, for property located at 14960 Landmark Boulevard, that is currently zoned Commercial-1 (C-1), to allow the sale of beer and wine for off-premises consumption.

<u>Fiscal Year 2024 Budget.</u> Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on an Ordinance of the Town of Addison, Texas approving and adopting the Annual Budget for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2024 and making appropriations for each office, department, agency and project of the Town, providing that expenditures for said Fiscal Year shall be made in accordance with the adopted budget, unless otherwise authorized by an Ordinance adopted by the City Council, and providing for emergency expenditures and expenditures as otherwise allowed by law.

<u>Fiscal Year 2024 Tax Rate.</u> Hold a public hearing, present, discuss, and consider action on an Ordinance to levy taxes for the Town of Addison, Texas, and to fix and adopt the tax rate of \$0.609822 for the Town on all taxable property for the Fiscal Year beginning October 1, 2023 and ending September 30, 2024.

Addison Callers Can Now Share Video with 911 Dispatchers

New technology recently rolled out by the North Texas Emergency Communications

Center (NTECC) allows callers to share video from their phones with dispatchers. A stateof-the-art program, Prepared 911 functions like a FaceTime call once the caller opts in through a texted link. Dispatchers are able to see what the caller sees and the video is recorded to be used by police departments as evidence, but also to assess and improve emergency responses.

According to NTECC Executive Director Terry Goswick, the program is best used for active shooter situations, large fires, and automobile accidents that are on the interstate. This WFAA news story provides additional information from Goswick on Prepared 911.

NTECC, which serves Addison, Carrollton, Farmers Branch and Coppell, is the first agency in the country to roll out this enhanced 911 service.
